- * Note: The lines will not disappear if you iron them before doing Sashiko.


Materials



- > Cloth: Sashiko cloth ("Sarashi-momen", cotton)
- > Sashiko threads (cotton)
- > Paperbox panel for display
- > Sashiko needle: 1 piece

How to make

- 1. Fold the cloth in half.
- 2. Stack two and stitch them.
- 3. Wash by hand and then iron.
- * Since it is a double layer, sew 1-2cm outside the design with basting thread to keep the cloth from slipping.
- * Finished size: 20 cm x 20 cm x 2 cm (8" x 8" x 0.8")

What is "Sashiko"?

"Sashiko" is a Japanese traditional embroidery. It is said that Sashiko stitch technique was born in North East of Japan 500 years ago. For the purpose of reinforcing clothes and heat preservation, people stitched in the space between threads of the fabric with white threads to cover the hollows. It is very Running Stitch. Many things in the daily life like animals, flowers, tools and other natural things were incorporated into Sashiko patterns (straight and curved lines).

Olympus recreated them on its Sashiko clothes (the pre-printed patterns will disappear after washing).

What is "Hitome-zashi"?

"Hitome-zashi" is one of Sashiko stitching techniques. Its stitching is made in the order in the same direction as vertical, horizontal, and the diagonal stitches. It makes beautiful symmetric patterns on the fabric as well.

How to stitch Hitome-zashi

- (a) Stitch straight lines in one step direction. There are no curved lines.

 For example, if the vertical straight line is stitched first,
 the horizontal straight line stitched, and then the diagonal straight line stitch is made.
- (b) When using Olympus pre-printed Sashiko cloth, first, stitch the printed stitches in order.
- (c) Stitch faithfully on the pre-printed line. That is important for the next overlapping stitches to overlap neatly.

At the end

Sashiko & Hitome-zashi is a handicraft that allows you to empty your mind and focus on stitching! You could have time to relax while moving your hands. Enjoy a relaxing time with Sashiko.

Stitching Order -


- * The design is not actual size.

- * The stitching order is a guideline for a beautiful finish.



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Basics of Sashiko How to handle thread Thread processing ◆ Start stitching (Cover stitch) ◆ End of stitching (Blind stitch) *Cut with a knot ring and make it 1m long. Insert the needle from the wrong side of the cloth at 3 stitches Bring the needle out to the back and make 3 stitches back Pull out one by one. to start stitching, and return 3 stitches with a stitch that is so that it does not go over the already stitched thread with the smaller stitches smaller than the regular stitch. And then stitch over it with regular stitches. Thread Right side Wrong side (Back) End (Back) How to thread a needle How to connect threads Loop the end of the thread and pass it through the eye of the needle. When connecting the thread in the middle, use a blind stitch to stop the thread and stitch a new thread over it. Place a bath-towel on the ironing board and press lightly with a steam iron to prevent the stitches from collapsing. ② Wash with lukewarm water.
