## Stitch list


#### 1) Back stitch

Stitch that pierces the line where the stitch eyes are connected.



Take out the needle from 1 and go back to Stitch the thread straight with one 2 and go out to 3. The needle that came out in 3 repeats returning to 1



## (3) Outline stitch


It is a stitch that can pierce both straight lines and curves



Stitch from left to right according to the design. Go out from 1 and go into 2, put out from the center of 1 and 2, and go back halfway at a glance. 2 and 5 are the same hole.

#### 4 French knot stitch

Make a small knot. The size changes depending on the number of threads and the number of windings.






Wrap the thread around the needle that came out of 1. Insert the needle vertically into 2 near 1 and tighten the thread before pulling out the needle. Becareful not to the tightening thread.

\* Wind twice with this kit.

## (5) Fly stitch


Stitch in a Y shape. Various applications can be made by changing the pulling strength and the length of the stitch to be stopped at the end.



Take out the needle in 1, scoop the cloth with 2 and 3, put a thread on the needle, enter 4 and stitch so that it becomes a Y shape. If you change the pulling strength of the thread, the shape will change like  $\forall$  or  $\forall$ . \* With this kit, the thread is pulled tightly.

# 6 Coral stitch


A knotted stitch worked from right to left.



Loop the small scooped needle tip and stitch while tying a knot.

## (7) Zigzag stitch

It is a stitch that pierces the zigzag line.



Stitch according to the design. Two rows of staggered backstitches line up on the back stitch.


### (8) Feather stitch It is an application of fly stitch.



Stitch alternately left and right from top to bottom.

## (9) Buttonhole stitch


Also known as blanket stitching. Various applications can be made by changing the stitch length and spacing.



Go out of 1 and go into 2, thread the needle that came out of 3 and go into 4. Make sure that the pulling strength of the thread is uniform.

#### (10) Herringbone stitch


Stitch various lines by changing the stitch spacing and angle.



Stitch from left to right alternately up and down.

#### (11) Chevron stitch


Stitch that pierces a thick line



Take out the needle from the center of each of the upper and lower needles and stitch them alternately up and down. 4&7, 8&11 are the same holes.

#### (12) Bullion stitch

A three-dimensional stitch that winds a thread around a needle.



Hold the needle that came out in step 3 and wind the thread around the needle according to the length of the needle. Hold the wound thread with your finger so that it does not loosen, pull out the needle, tilt it toward you, and tighten the thread to enter 4. \* Wind 8 times with this kit.
